BACKGROUND | ANALYSIS

Health & Safety Code Section (HSC) 34177 (o) (1) requires Successor Agencies to make payments due for enforceable obligations incurred by the Dissolved Redevelopment Agencies. This is accomplished through the annual payment schedules (ROPS) which must be approved by the Successor Agency and then the Oversight Board and submitted to the Department of Finance by February 1, 2019.

The Successor Agency paid the balance of the HELP loan last year. It will continue to make extra principal payments on the RDLP Loan as well. The Successor Agency made a \$725,000 payment on the RDLP debt in December 2018.

Bret Harmon will present the ROPS at the Oversight Board Meeting on January 11, 2019.

BENEFIT TO OR IMPACT ON CITY RESOURCES

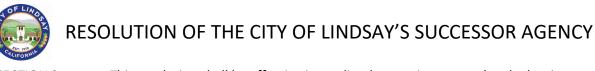

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council approves conditional use permit No. 18-34, based on these findings and subject to the following conditions, which are included in the attached draft resolution.

- All special events would conclude no later than 1:30 am.
- A State of California ABC License type 40 would be required prior to providing any alcoholic beverage. Any other ABC license would require separate approval by Council.
- Upon approval, compliance with the zoning ordinance and use permit conditions of approval would be reviewed by staff at the following intervals:
 - o 3 months
 - o 6 months
 - o 12 months
 - o 18 months
 - And yearly thereafter
- Any infractions of the zoning ordinance or use permit conditions of approval would result in the automatic suspension of the use permit and require a review by Council within 30 days where it could revoke the use permit or impose requirements to ensure full compliance.
- Whenever alcohol is served, security would be provided by the property owner in a number approved by Public Safety. Public safety could require an increase in security personnel or allow a decrease as it is deemed appropriate.
- Any new exterior signs would require separate review and approval by City staff.

BACKGROUND | ANALYSIS

The site has served as a special events venue for many years and was granted a conditional use permit in 2008 to allow for a special event facility with alcohol sales. The venue has changed ownership and sat vacant for a period of time, necessitating the need for a conditional use permit related to the sale of alcohol sales. The CUP for the special event facility runs with the land.

The site is surrounded by a mixture of commercial, office, and residential uses. To the north is a vacant lot with a residence to its east; to the south is a restaurant and residence; to the west is an auto repair facility and a residence; and to the east are several professional offices, a bakery, and residences.

Staff finds that the request for conditional use permit approval for the sale of alcoholic beverages is consistent with the requirements of the zoning ordinance. Conditional use permit approval would allow for the sale of beer in conjunction with the existing use of special event center. The site is approved for a special event center, as granted by Conditional Use Permit No. 18-06 and amended by Resolution 13-40, and its operation and use-compliance can be monitored *. Parking is adequate and would be provided by an existing 39 space parking lot at the north end of the site. Access to the parking lot would be taken from either Elmwood Avenue of Apia Street.

Regarding the sale of alcohol, section 18.10.040.D of the zoning ordinance permits bar, cocktail lounge, and nightclub use within the Service Commercial (CS) zoning district with Council's approval. Council may, therefore, grant the sale of alcohol in the special event center. The following is excerpted from the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control "Common ABC License Types and Their Basic Privileges" to describe the type of alcohol license being requested:

• **40 ON SALE BEER** - Authorizes the sale of beer for consumption on or off the premises where sold. No wine or distilled spirits may be on the premises. Full meals are not required; however, *sandwiches or snacks must be available*. Minors are allowed on the premises.

* To ensure compliance with the zoning ordinance and conditions of approval, section 18.17.130 of the zoning ordinance allows for the automatic suspension of a use permit upon violation of the zoning ordinance, or upon failure to comply with conditions of the approving resolution. Within 30 days, Council would consider the suspension and if not satisfied with the applicant's compliance, could revoke the use permit or take actions necessary to ensure compliance.

ALTERNATIVES

• Disapprove the request for an ABC Type 40 license

BENEFIT TO OR IMPACT ON CITY RESOURCES

The project is not anticipated to negatively impact City Resources. The business will be monitored closely to ensure Public Safety resources are not impacted.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Article 19 §15301 identifies the minor alteration of an existing private facility as Categorically Exempt. A draft Notice of Exemption has been prepared and has been available for public review.

POLICY ISSUES

The subject property is zoned CS (Service Commercial) and is at the southeast corner of Elmwood Avenue and Apia Street. The zoning ordinance requires that the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption in the requested setting must be granted with the approval of a conditional use permit.

Section 18.17.070 of the zoning ordinance states that the city council may grant an application for a conditional use when the council makes *all of* the following findings:

- That there are circumstances or conditions applicable to the land, structure or use which makes the granting of a use permit necessary for the preservation and enjoyment of a substantial property right.
- That the proposed location of the conditional use is in accordance with the objectives of the zoning code and the purposes of the district in which the site is located.
- That the proposed use will comply with each of the applicable provisions of this title.

PUBLIC OUTREACH

The agenda for this public hearing was posted on January 4, 2019.

The public hearing for this conditional use permit application was noticed on December 19, 2018 in the Porterville Recorder and by individual mailings to those property owners within 300 feet of the project site.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINDSAY DOES HEREBY RESOLVE that the project is exempt from further environmental review pursuant to CEQA Article 19, Section §15301.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINDSAY DOES HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVE that the City Council of the City of Lindsay finds that the proposed conditional use permit application is consistent with the provisions of the City of Lindsay Zoning Ordinance (Municipal Code Title 18). Specifically, the application meets all applicable city codes and ordinances, per the requirements of Sections 18.17.030 and 18.17.070.C.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that that the City Council of the City of Lindsay hereby approves Conditional Use Permit Application No. 18-34, subject to the following conditions:

SECTION 1. That a California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control type 40 license shall be obtained prior to selling any alcoholic beverage. No other license type shall be permitted under this condition of approval, and conditions of said license shall be complied with.

SECTION 2. That compliance with the zoning ordinance and use permit conditions of approval, listed herein, shall be reviewed by staff at the following intervals:

- a) Three (3) months
- b) Six (6) months



RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LINDSAY

- c) Twelve (12) months
- d) Eighteen (18) months
- e) Yearly thereafter.

SECTION 3. That any infraction of the zoning ordinance or use permit conditions of approval shall result in the automatic suspension of the use permit and shall require a review by City Council within thirty (30) days. Upon review, City Council may at its discretion, revoke the use permit, impose requirements to ensure full compliance, or allow the use to continue.

SECTION 4. That whenever alcohol is served, security shall be provided by the property owner in a number approved by Public Safety. Public Safety may require an increase in security personnel if it is deemed necessary or permit a decrease in security personnel as conditions dictate.

SECTION 5. That if, in the opinion of the Chief of Police, based on historical evidence, an undue burden has been placed upon Public Safety, the use permit shall be subject to review and modification, or revocation.

SECTION 6. That all exterior signs shall require separate review and approval by the City Planner. A sign permit shall be required for any new exterior signs, prior to sign installation. All permanent and temporary signs, banners, and/or other special promotional signage shall comply will all applicable Zoning Ordinance sign standards.

SECTION 7. That all other City codes and ordinances shall apply.

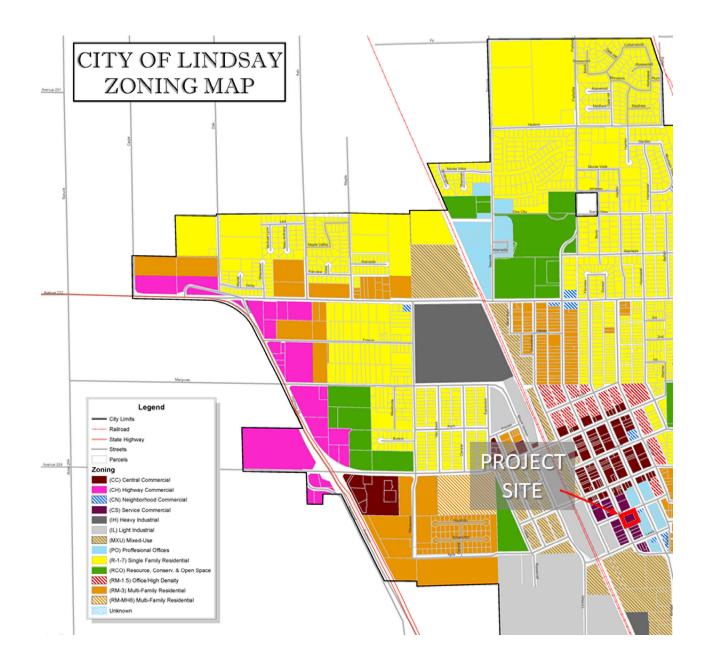

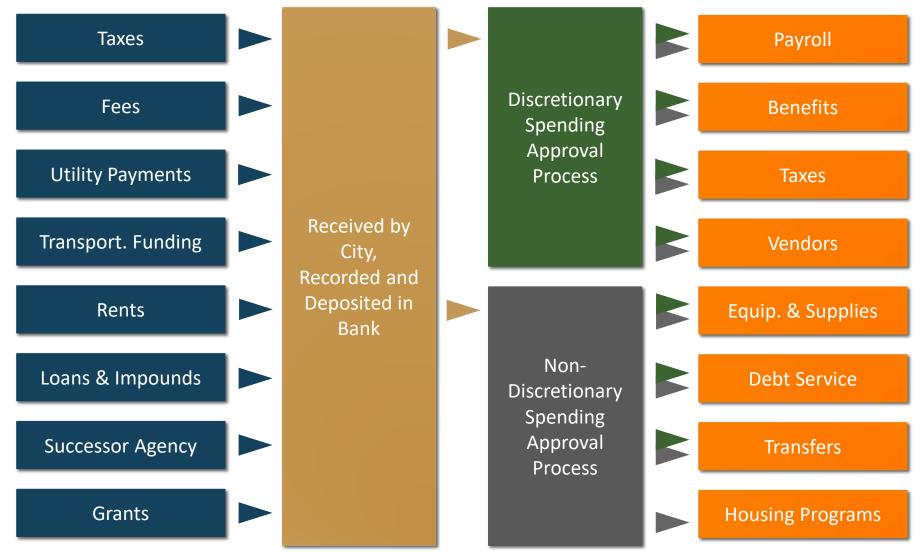

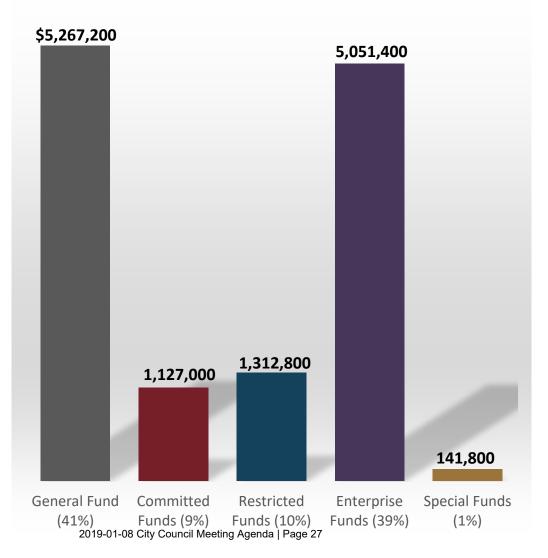

BACKGROUND | ANALYSIS

The quarterly notification for Disinfection By Products (DBP) is a requirement of the State of California Water Resources Control Board (DWR). This is the fourth quarter notification for 2018 and as long as our system exceeds the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for DBP, quarterly notification will be required by DHS. The first notification was released January, 2017 (for fourth quarter of 2016).

The template for this letter was provided by the DHS. It is their approved language; we update this notice with our sample result values, in a running annual average.

While the system exceeds the MCL for DBP, the notice states that this is not an emergency and that an alternate source of water in not needed. It also points out that persons with specific health concerns consult their doctor.

Disinfection byproducts are chemical, organic and inorganic substances that can form during a reaction of a disinfectant with naturally present organic matter in the water. Byproducts that are regulated are Total Trihalomethane (TTHM) and five Haloacidic acids (HAA5). The DBP's are a result of our primary chlorine disinfection process of surface water.

City of Lindsay has levels of Disinfection Byproducts Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently failed a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Test results continue show that our system exceeds the standard or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for Total Trihalomethane (TTHM) and/or 5 Haloacidic Acids (HAA5). The MCL standard for THM is 0.080 ug/L and for HAA5 is 0.060 ug/L. The running average level of TTHM and HAA5 over the last year at each site is listed below;

What should I do?

You <u>do not</u> need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply. This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately.

Some people who drink water containing TTHM's in excess of the MCL over many years may experience liver, kidney, or central nervous system problems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. Some people who drink water containing HAA5's in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

If you have other health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What was done?

Disinfection byproducts (TTHM and HAA5) are chemical, organic and inorganic substances that can form during a reaction of a disinfectant with naturally present organic matter in a water supply. TTHM and HAA5 samples are collected each quarter and a running annual average (RAA) is calculated for compliance.

The City has identified preliminary costs of renovating our primary disinfection process and until the project is funded and completed, will closely monitor operations to strive to lower TTHM and HAA5 levels. We will continue to sample and test TTHM and HAA5 at locations throughout the City and provide public notification as required.

We anticipate resolution of the problem within 14 months. If testing results show a reduction in TTHM and HAA5 levels, this will be identified in the next quarterly water system update. Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS: Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.

Award Test Well Project to Qualified Bidder

BACKGROUND | ANALYSIS

The City was successful in obtaining a Proposition 1 Drinking Water Planning Grant (Grant) in 2016. The scope of the planning grant was to determine best mitigation measure for the DBCP issue at Well 14 (which has been in compliance since November 2016) and determine location and drill a test well to determine if a new production well could be developed.

Staff has been pursing a suitable, approvable location to drill a test well for nearly one year. Thirteen test well locations have been pursued on 8 different sites. Sites varied from inside city limits to outside of city limits, both private property and publicly held property. There has been cooperation from property owners to allow the City to collect water samples from existing well sources and conduct water quality testing with results that were not acceptable. Other issues that prevented selection of certain locations were proximity to other groundwater sources or potential conflicting improvements (both surface and underground) or proximity to property lines.

Staff has presented information to Council regarding the ability to drill a test well on the soccer park (Lindsay Sports Complex) property. There was limited support at that time for the locations presented. Staff has continued to communicate with our project consulting team (Keller and Wegley Consulting Civil Engineers and subconsultant Ken Schmidt, Hydrogeologist) regarding usable area at the city park. This area is identified on Exhibit II.

The timing of this portion of the project is limited and must be completed by March 31, 2019. With the complications of identifying a location supported by all involved, the window of project advertising and receiving bids was reduced to meet minimum standards. Bids will be received on Monday, January 7, 2019. The bid(s) will be tabulated and reviewed for accuracy or abnormalities. A recommendation will be presented to Council on Tuesday, January 8, 2019. The bid abstract and contractor verifications will be completed by Keller and Wegley Consulting Civil Engineers.

FUNDING

As identified above, Proposition 1 Drinking Water Planning Grant is providing funding for this portion of the project. This test well portion of the project has a \$225,000 identified value. This value includes all technical data, project specifications, test well drilling, water quality testing and, as needed, recommendation of final well development at this location.

ALTERNATIVES

- Award project as recommended.
- Do not award and provide direction to staff. This would potentially jeopardize meeting funding time requirements.
