American Rescue Plan Act Of 2021 (ARPA)

- Signed into law by President Biden in April
- Included \$1.9 trillion as emergency relief for COVID-19 impacts
- Provided direct investments for:
 - Local governments
 - Businesses
 - Individuals
 - Homeowners and renters

American Rescue Plan Act Of 2021 (ARPA)

- Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds created with \$350 billion in funding
- In May, the U.S. Department of the Treasury released its guidance on the use of funding:
 - COVID-19 response efforts
 - Replace lost public sector revenue
 - Support economic stabilization for households and businesses
 - Address contributing systemic public health and economic challenge
- Interim Final guidance expected soon

Distribution, Reporting and Deadlines

- Distribution:
 - Allocation of funding is made in two tranches
 - 50 percent in May 2021 and 50 percent twelve months later
- Reporting:
 - Interim Report: August 31, 2021
 - Quarterly project and Expenditure Reports
- Deadlines
 - Obligation deadline: December 31, 2024
 - Expenditure deadline: December 31, 2024

Ineligible Uses of Funding

Offsets in reductions to net tax revenue due to a change in law since March 3, 2021

Pension fund deposits

Debt service or legal settlements or judgements Rainy day fund or financial reserve deposits

Eligible Uses of Funds

- Support public health expenditures
- Address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency
- Replace lost public sector revenue (if eligible)
- Provide premium pay for essential workers
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure

Use: Public Health Response

- Funds may address a broad range of public health needs across COVID-19 mitigation, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and public health resources:
 - Services and programs to contain and mitigate the spread of COVID-19
 - Services to address behavioral healthcare needs exacerbated by the pandemic
 - Payroll and covered benefits expenses

Use: Negative Economic Impacts

- Delivering assistance to workers and families
- Supporting small business
- Speeding the recovery of the tourism, travel and hospitality sectors

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- Rebuilding public sector capacity
- Serving the hardest hit communities and families by addressing health disparities, investing in housing and neighborhoods, addressing educational disparities, and promoting healthy childhood environments

Use: Lost Public Sector Revenue (if eligible)

- Allow local governments to continue to provide valuable public services and ensure that fiscal austerity measures do not hamper economic recovery
- Recipients compute the extent of their reduction in revenue by comparing their actual revenue to an alternative representing what could have been expected in the absence of the pandemic
- Recipients have broad latitude to use funding to support government services

Use: Premium Pay for Essential Workers

- Essential workers have put their physical well-being at risk to meet the needs of their communities and to provide care for others
- Many of these essential workers have not received compensation for the heightened risk they faced and continue to face

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 Recipients may use funding to provide premium pay directly, or through grants to private employers, to a broad range of essential workers

Use: Infrastructure Investments

- Drinking water infrastructure projects, such as building or upgrading facilities and transmission, distribution and storage systems
- Wastewater infrastructure projects, including treatment infrastructure, stormwater, and water reuse
- Broadband infrastructure and efforts in areas that are unserved or underserved

American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 Overview

- City of Lindsay Allocation (charter city, pop. 13,463)
 - \$3,220,636.00
- Payment in two tranches
 - First half (\$1,610,318.00) after submission of executed award terms and conditions (Received 07-13-2021)

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- Second half (\$1,610,318.00) one year later
- Separate fund to be established

- Prioritize spending
- Solicit Public input
- Produce federally mandated documentation
- Track Progress

ARPA: Proposed Spending Plan

- Water & Sewer: \$2M for projects based on CIP Budget
 - \$1.4M on Water
 - \$600k on Sewer
- Economic Recovery
 - \$800k
- Premium Pay
 - TBD
- Contingency / Additional Water or Sewer Projects
 - \$100k \$400k
