

## **State Requirements for Animal Control Services**

01

#### Sheltering and Adoption Services

Provide shelter for stray, abandoned, and surrendered dogs

Facilitate adoption services for these dogs

02

#### Minimum Holding Period

Hold dogs for a minimum of 6 days before adoption if the owner is unknown

03

#### **Animal Bite Response**

Respond to reports of animal bites

Investigate incidents of animal bites

04

#### Microchipping Requirement

Ensure dogs adopted are microchipped as per AB 2723

05

#### Law Enforcement and Spay/Neuter Programs

Enforce laws, codes, and regulations related to animals

Implement spay/neuter programs to control animal population

## **Evolution of Animal Control Services in Lindsay**

01

#### Partnership Dynamics

Lindsay Kennel was previously owned and operated by the City of Lindsay.

In 2009, a partnership was formed with the City of Porterville to operate the Lindsay Kennel for \$1.

Ownership transferred to Porterville in 2013.

02

## Contract Termination with Porterville

Contract terminated in February 2024.

Services ending on September 1st, 2024.

Impacting the housing of 125 live dogs.

# Exploring Outsourcing Options

Limited options in the area.

Unsuccessful attempts with Tulare County due to overcapacity.

Escalating costs with Visalia Animal Care Center. 05

#### In-House Solution Proposal

City staff recommend an inhouse solution.

Utilizing an existing structure at the City Yard.

Kennels for short and moderate-term dog storage.

Aiming for significant cost savings compared to external contracts.

## City Yard Transformation: Setting Up Kennels for Dogs

#### **Utilizing Existing Structure**

Location: City Yard, 356 N. Mt. Vernon

Repurposing current facilities for kennel setup 02

#### Purchase of Kennels

Short-term and moderate-term storage solutions

Variety of kennel sizes to accommodate different needs

03

#### Indoor and Outdoor Pens

Mixture of indoor and outdoor pens

Shade and large fans for cooling in outdoor areas

#### Cost Efficiency

Initial setup costs

Significant savings compared to contracting with another facility
