

BOND ACT SIGN GUIDELINES

Types of Signs

Construction - A sign acknowledging the California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access for All Act of 2018 as the funding source for the project must be installed during construction and at completion (PRC §80001(b)(3)). If appropriate, the same sign can be used during construction and completion.

Post Completion – A funding acknowledgment sign must be installed before the final project inspection and remain in place for at least four (4) years from date of project completion. There is no minimum or maximum size other than the minimum size for the logo, as long as the sign contains the required wording.

Sign Language

All signs must contain the language shown in page 2 of Attachment B. The name of the director of the local agency or other governing body may be added, as well as the names (and/or logos) of other partners, organizations, individuals, and elected representatives. *This project is also funded by Caltrans so their logo will need to be incorporated as well.*

Logo

All signs must display the Parks and Water Bond Act logo. The logo is available at <http://resources.ca.gov/grants/logo-art/>. The logo must be mounted in an area maximizing visibility and durability. Each edge of the logo must be a minimum of 24" x 24". When appropriate, exceptions may be approved at the State's discretion.

Sign Construction

All materials used shall be durable and resistant to the elements and graffiti. The California Department of Parks and Recreation and California Department of Transportation standards may be used as a guide for gauge of metal, quality of paints used, mounting specifications, etc.

Sign Cost

The cost of the sign(s) is an eligible project cost. Permanent signage is highly encouraged.

Appropriateness of Signs

For projects where the required sign may be out of place or affected by local sign ordinances, the Grants Administrator may authorize a sign that is more appropriate to the project.

State Approval

Contractor shall submit a proof of the sign to the City before proceeding with ordering signs. Grantee shall submit the proposed number, location(s), size, and language of signs for review prior to ordering signs. Final funds for projects will not be reimbursed until signage has been approved and installed.

CLEAN CALIFORNIA LOCAL GRANT PROGRAM SIGN GUIDELINES

Types of Signs

Construction - A sign acknowledging the Clean California Local Grant Program as a funding source for the project.

Post Completion – A funding acknowledgment sign must be installed before the final project inspection and remain in place for at least four (4) years from date of project completion. There is no minimum or maximum size other than the minimum size for the logo, as long as the sign contains the required wording.

Sign Language

There is no language requirement for this funding source, however, acknowledgment that the Clean California Local Grant Program will need to be included. Their logo will need to be incorporated on the sign.

Logo

The Clean California logo is available in different formats. Use vector logos for printed projects (EPS and AI formats) and raster/pixel-based logos for other media (PNG). If you have questions about formatting or are not sure which is best to use, contact the Clean California Graphic Design Manager. (<https://cleancalifornia.dot.ca.gov/about/logos>)

Do not alter the colors for the logo in any way. This includes making the logo monochromatic (completely black or white). A grayscale logo may only be represented in grayscale printed collateral.

If adjusting the scale of the logo, do not make the logo so small as to not be able to clearly read “Clean California.” Never alter the proportion of the logo. It must always be represented as a perfect circle.

Please allow space around the logo when placing next to other logos. As a rule of thumb, allow space equal to 1/4 the width of the Clean California logo. For example, if the placed logo is 1”, then allow for at least .25” of space between the Clean California logo and another logo.

Sign Construction

All materials used shall be durable and resistant to the elements and graffiti. The standards will need to follow the Bond Act Sign standards.

Sign Cost

The cost of the sign(s) is an eligible project cost. Permanent signage is highly encouraged.

Appropriateness of Signs

For projects where the required sign may be out of place or affected by local sign ordinances, the Grants Administrator may authorize a sign that is more appropriate to the project.

State Approval

Approval of this sign will depend on the Bond Act Sign state approval.
